Contact with someone suffering from coronavirus	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Staff • Pupils • Contractors • Visitors 	<p>Everyone will be asked not to come into school if they or anyone they live with is experiencing coronavirus symptoms, and instead follow official self-isolation guidance. Regular reminders will be given about this.</p> <p>Anyone self-isolating with symptoms will be encouraged to access testing, and the school will help them do this.</p> <p>If a symptomatic person comes into school, they will be sent home immediately or isolated until they can be picked up. Isolate in medical room (One student at a time) – see this guidance for help with this.</p> <p>999 will be called if they are seriously ill or injured or their life is at risk.</p> <p>In the case of a symptomatic pupil who needs to be supervised before being picked up:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If a distance of 2m can't be maintained, supervising staff will wear a fluid-resistant surgical mask • If contact is necessary, supervising staff will also wear disposable gloves and a disposable apron • If there's a risk of splashing to the eyes, such as from coughing, spitting or vomiting, supervising staff will also wear eye protection <p>Supervising staff will wash their hands thoroughly for 20 seconds after the pupil has been picked up.</p> <p>A deep clean will take place in the areas that the symptomatic person has been in, and PPE will be disposed of properly, following decontamination guidance.</p> <p>If a pupil or a staff member working with pupils tests positive for coronavirus, the rest of their pupil group will</p>	Badr – LEA Fazal - AMS	8 th June 2020	<p>Staff have been briefed of handling symptomatic pupils, all staff are first aiders</p> <p>The will be a DSL on Site, and other DSIs will be on call if needed</p> <p>PPE available for use in the library (AMS) medical rooms and school's office when required</p>

These items will not be shared between children between washes.</p> <p>Areas of the school that are used by pupils will be cleaned thoroughly at the end of the day.</p> <p>Unnecessary items, soft furnishings, soft toys and other toys that are hard to clean will be removed from areas being used and stored elsewhere.</p> <p>Any equipment that is shared will be cleaned between groups of children using it and multiple groups won't use it simultaneously.</p> <p>Shared rooms, such as halls and dining areas, will be cleaned between different groups using them.</p> <p>If a person with coronavirus symptoms comes into school, a deep clean will take place in the areas that the person has been in, following decontamination guidance.</p> <p>Cleaning supplies will be topped up regularly and monitored to make sure they're not close to running out.</p> <p>Teachers will wash their hands and surfaces before and after handling pupils' books.</p>

LEA: Teachers will need to switch between groups if subject specialism is needed.</p> <p>For physical activity, contact sports will be avoided. Outdoor sports will be prioritised where possible, or large indoor spaces used where it is not. Distance between pupils will be maximised as much as possible.</p> <p>Staff can work across different groups in order to deliver the school timetable, but they will keep their distance from pupils and other staff as much as they can (ideally 2 metres apart). This won't always be possible, particularly when working with younger children, but close face-to-face contact will be avoided, and time spent within 1 metre will be minimised.</p> <p>Any pupils with complex needs or who need close contact care will have the same support as normal as distancing isn't possible here. Staff will be rigorous about hand washing and respiratory hygiene.</p> <p>Supply teachers, and other temporary staff will be told to minimise contact and maintain as much distance as possible from other staff. The number of temporary staff entering the school premises will be kept to a minimum.</p>

They will be cleaned between each use if another groups uses it. Spreading infection due to excessive contact and mixing in meetings		<p>Where possible, all meetings will be conducted by telephone or using video conferencing. This includes meetings with staff, parents, visitors and governors.</p> <p>Where this isn't possible, essential meetings will be conducted outside, or in a room large enough to allow for social distancing.</p>			
Individuals vulnerable to serious infection coming into school		<p>For everyone who could come into school:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If they're clinically extremely vulnerable (as defined here), they will continue to learn or work from home • If they're clinically vulnerable (as defined here) – parents should follow medical advice if their child is in this category, and staff in this category will continue to work from home wherever possible. If these staff members cannot work from home, they will be given a role that allows them to be kept 2 metres away from others wherever possible • If they live with someone who's clinically extremely vulnerable, they will only attend if stringent social distancing can be adhered to and, in the case of children, they're able to understand and follow those 	MB	8 th June 2020
